

agreed to find out. Rich Williamson will coordinate with Jim Bennett to get the matter on the Board of Supervisors' agenda.

6. Discussion on how to involve more 'regional' issues
 - a. Canebrake withdrawal
 - b. Improve water supplies for known economically disadvantaged areas (e.g., eliminate bottled water deliveries)
 - c. Sewering of economically disadvantaged areas

Mr. Rolwing pointed out that agencies cannot be forced to join the IRWM Program, but we should document continual efforts to include them.

Discussion followed over dissention occurring in Canebrake, where a vocal faction is opposing IRWM participation. Carl McKenney reiterated his commitment to the Program and offered to propose a CCWD Board Resolution in support of it. Mr. Rolwing agreed to work with Diana Del Bono to draft one. To date, Canebrake has not withdrawn.

Mr. Mills suggested the Subcommittee look at more projects of a regional nature. One suggestion was to eliminate the need for bottled water deliveries to Slab City, but after discussion it was agreed that this is out of our area. Other possibilities include filtration, education and testing to reduce the need for bottled water locally.

Mr. Rolwing pointed out that in terms of sewer service expansion, Santiago Estates is particularly in need of a sewer system. The only other mobile home park with no sewer service is Holiday Homes. Roadrunner Club is gradually converting over. Mr. Williamson suggested considering a septic tank effluent system, whereby the tanks would remain in place and be maintained by the District, but the leach fields would be replaced by a line to the treatment plant. This would save money, particularly for Santiago Estates. It was agreed to revisit the sewer issue during the next phase of the IRWMP.

Mr. Rolwing reported he had sent follow-up correspondence to the Indian tribes and Majestic Pines and Jacumba Water Districts regarding IRWM participation, but they still have not joined. Mr. Williamson suggested we concentrate on more likely participants such as the State Park, which has indicated a need to replace some wells. Staff will contact Kathy Dice and encourage her continued participation, and also obtain a copy of their capital improvement plan.

8. Next Subcommittee meeting on November 16th instead of the 23rd or skip November and meet in mid December (14th) at Borrego Water District

Mr. Williamson pointed out that we will continue our study and develop an IRWM Plan regardless of the outcome of the planning grant application, to preserve eligibility to apply for an implementation grant. Detailed discussion was continued to the next meeting, and Mr. Mills will prepare a proposed schedule. There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 10:50 a.m. The next meeting was scheduled for Tuesday, December 14 at 9:00 a.m. at the Borrego Water District.
