II. ITEMS FOR BOARD CONSIDERATION AND POSSIBLE ACTION

A. Welcome/Introductions/Overview of Agenda – President K. Dice welcomed everyone to the townhall meeting and gave a brief overview of the history of the district. Directors and staff were introduced. Director Dice also presented an overview of the judgement and the roll of the Watermaster and the five representatives of the Basin.

- 1. Borrego Water District
 - i. 2023 Year in Review and 2024 Priorities Director Baker presented the reserves and provided a summary of the purpose of the reserves, the capital improvement program and provided the deferred maintenance that was being done now with the use of grants and the purchase of water rights, \$30 million, has flowed into the basin because the water district is working hard to bring that money to us.
 - ii. Water Quality Analysis Director Baker explained that the district has always maintained good quality water, passed all the water testing, and water quality continues to be good.

Director baker briefly went over three projects that have been completed, a new well 5-15, tank replacements, the purchase of two (2) farms which will give the district 640 acre feet a year of water.

Director Baker explained the other projects the water district supported was supporting, the watermaster with water from the wells for studies, educational internship program, and air quality monitoring program.

To close her presentation Director Baker presented a water rate comparison and explained the tiers.

PUBLIC QUESTIONS: "is the \$100K that T2 gave the BWD, is that for the upcoming development project?" - Director Baker explained that California law is any work that it does, New development must be paid by the developer, not by you the rate payers.

"Is there a water agreement in place for BWD to deliver T2 water for their new development" – No, there is no agreement, a lot of research that needs to be done but no agreement.

"if you have a vacant legal parcel with or without a water meter now, is there any obligation by Brave a water district serve those parcels?" Does the water districts have a legal or moral obligation to acquire a bit extra water, in order to serve those 3000, or so, vacant parcels that are scattered to the valley?" - If there's a meter on the vacant parcel, then yes, the water district is required to have enough water right, if there is no meter on the parcel then the developer must acquire the water rights and transfer to the district. The district has set aside a portion of water rights for a small developers.

"Are there any initiatives or anything that you're in to possibly lower the cost of water?" - That's our purpose, we would like to keep the rates as low as possible, reality is we all know that the costs for everything goes up. But we're always very cost conscious.

<u>Intera Presentation</u> – provided a summary of the Borrego Springs Water Supply, pumping reductions have been achieved in excess of the Pumping ramp down rate required by your judgement. Total pumping in water year 20 23 was about 50% below the annual baseline pumping allocation, the reduction in pumping is significantly ahead of your required ramp down schedule. Intera also performed an updated groundwater quality risk assessment.

B. Proposition 68 Project Overviews

- 1. Borrego Springs Watermaster Samantha Adams provided an overview of the Watermaster projects.
- i. Farmland Fallowing The Biological restoration of fallow lands, which is funded by at about \$760,000, the purpose of the study is to be able to start to determine, what are the best management practices for biological restoration on fallowed lands specific to the Borrego Springs environment.
- ii. GMP Update Project is focused on performing monitoring, reporting, and other activities that support the implementation of the judgement and the groundwater management plan project is nearly \$2 million worth of funding. Goals and utilizing this grant funding is to improve datasets related to groundwater pumping, groundwater levels, groundwater quality, help to address the existence of abandoned wells in the basin that can cause potential public health threats to improve the understanding of the amount of water that's available in the groundwater basin, and that can safely be pumped without causing negative impacts, and as well as to enhance our stakeholder education and outreach efforts. The funding allowed us to develop a comprehensive groundwater level and groundwater quality monitoring plan, focused on enhancing the and get the existing monitoring network, that was in place, we've completed that, and that report is available on our website.
- iii. WQ Monitoring Network key element of this work plan, in order to expand this monitoring network was the development of public outreach materials to reach out to the Borrego Springs Community to get help identifying existing wells. Through these outreach materials, and support from folks like John Peterson and Jim Dax, and several others, we've been able to identify in Canvas over 20 wells in the basin to start assessing whether or not they can be added to our monitoring program.
- 2. University of California Groundwater Dependent Eco Systems Travis from UCI presented their project to look at the presence or absence and functioning of the systems in the valley that have the ability to access through their roots, the groundwater in the basin, and might contribute to changes in the water budget within the basin, a collaboration amongst three big groups, group scientists at University of California Irvine, folks doing the outreach and connect with the community through the Canyon Desert Conservancy and some biodiversity and natural specialists at the Sand, the Natural History Museum. Using remote sensing to assess the groundwater

pendent system, understand its health and performance and estimate water use.

- 3. Borrego Springs School District Martha Deichler presented a summary of the CTE program students in our high school would be the future people Borrego Springs that will be working here. The goal of this grant is to give those students other skills that allows them to stay in the valley. CTE course state gives standards at the state level, but it also required you to enter local elements. Goal is obviously to educate our students, what is going on with the water issue. Introductions to other jobs, irrigation specialist, water district, wastewater management, jobs with the park, energy. \$25K of the grant is for the BAI garden, for aquaponic lab, soil studies lab, irrigation lab, all hands on for students and the community.
- 4. Borrego Valley Stewardship Council Brie Fordem from the Borrego Valley Stewardship council in partnership with Civic well, is working on empowering Borrego Valleys, Sustainable Future, through the development of a community driven resilience strategy focused on informing and educating, encouraging public participation and community representation.

PUBLIC QUESTION: "how much time are you going to give this survey?" - about 30 days.

- 5. Borrego Water District
- i. Groundwater Monitoring Wells WWTP Diane Johnsons gave a summary regarding the monitoring wells, the BWD currently has one (1) monitoring well with grant funds the district has been able to build 3 more wells. These have been completed and BWD is waiting on first results.
- ii. Automated Metering Infrastructure Gina Moran presented a summary regarding the automated metering infrastructure that will be installed, pilot project design underway, which will be 100 meters, implemented by mid-month, April, And then the full 2100 meters will be integrated by November, 2024.

C. Questions and Answers -

"Travis's studies are incredibly excellent, I am wondering if there have been or will be any studies have been done with our animal lives in terms of what they consume in terms of water, and to our avery life, has there been any studies, or is there any future studies that may include them" - there would be like very preliminary back to the envelope calculations that relate to that assessment.

"what is the ratepayer overall total used annually" - About 1,500 acre feet per year.

"is Santiago Estates also on a master meter?" – Yes, owners will be mandating to add an automated metering system over time.

"Has Rams Hill Developer approached BWD about their plan?" – BWD has nothing to report, there is no agreement as of yet.

AGREEMENT

This Agreement is made and entered into as October 10, 2024, ("Effective Date") by and between the following Parties: Borrego Water District (BWD) and James L Wermers ("Wermers"). "Parties" as used in this Agreement shall collectively refer to BWD and Wermers. This Agreement is made with reference to the following facts:

RECITALS

- A. Wermers is the owner of The Mall in Borrego Springs. A BWD-owned fire hydrant (the "Hydrant") as well as a privately owned fire sprinkler connection ("Sprinklers") for The Mall parking garage are located in a courtyard area of the center part of The Mall south of Palm Canyon Drive. The Hydrant and Sprinklers have been in operation since construction of the development. Approximately 10 years ago, a 4-inch water meter was installed to provide flow to the Hydrant and Sprinklers. In mid-2024, the County of San Diego Fire Department concluded the Hydrant can be abandoned. In addition, Wermers is now planning to replace the original pipelines serving the Sprinklers.
- B. A dispute has arisen between the parties as to the ownership of the Hydrant and the piping and other infrastructure that conveys water from Palm Canyon Drive to the Hydrant ("Hydrant Infrastructure"). The parties also dispute whether the amount of monthly fees associated with the 4-inch meter paid by Wermers to BWD, since installation of the Hydrant, have been lawfully charged. This Agreement refers to these areas of dispute, collectively, as the "Dispute".
- C. BWD and Wermers have reached settlement of all claims and matters relating to the Dispute. BWD, on the one hand, and Wermers, on the other hand, now desire to fully and finally settle and resolve any and all rights, claims, disputes, potential causes of action, and claims which currently exist in favor of the Parties related to the Dispute. The Parties expressly intend that this settlement shall further pertain to any claims for interest, attorneys' fees, and/or all other costs or expenses associated with the Dispute.

NOW, THEREFORE, based upon the foregoing recitals which are incorporated herein by this reference as though set forth in full, and for valuable consideration the receipt and adequacy of which is hereby acknowledged, it is agreed by and between the parties hereto as follows:

1. Settlement

- 1.1 BWD agrees to provide a billing credit to the BWD Mall water account in the total sum of \$30,472.76 ("Settlement Amount"). This billing credit is intended to offset future Mall water bills.
- 1.2 The Parties agree that BWD responsibility related to water service stops at the public right of way, specifically BWD responsibility ends at the new 2" meter described below, and immediately before the existing 4" backflow preventer. The Backflow preventers for both the existing 4" Sprinkler the new 2" commercial connections will be owned by Wermers. The Parties also agree that BWD has and will have no written easement related to the Hydrant and Sprinklers, and to the extent BWD may hold any non-written easement rights related to the Hydrant related infrastructure, BWD hereby abandons any such rights in favor of Wermers.
- 1.3 Wermers agrees that BWD shall not be responsible for removing the Hydrant or Hydrant Infrastructure, nor for any liability associated with the removal or abandoning

in place, or future use by Wermers, of such facilities, including but not limited to any leaks from the Hydrant or Hydrant Infrastructure.

- 1.4 BWD will retain the existing 4-inch connection to serve Wermers backflow prevention device feeding the Sprinklers.
- 1.5 BWD will install adjacent to The Mall a new 2-inch meter and backflow device to serve The Mall's Commercial units, including restaurants, a grocery store, a beauty salon and other businesses. BWD will pay for installation of the meter and Wermers the backflow prevention device.
- 1.6 The Parties agree that BWD shall charge Wermers for its water service to The Mall going forward based upon the current 2-inch monthly base water fee. In addition, BWD will also charge Wermers a monthly private fire service fee for The Mall consistent with any such fees duly adopted by the BWD Board of Directors on or before July 2025.

2. Mutual Release

Contingent upon the full completion of the terms of this Agreement and the full crediting of the Settlement Amount, the Parties hereby release and discharge one another, and their respective officers, directors, trustees, shareholders, heirs, executors, administrators, attorneys, successors, assigns, principals, agents, servants, employees, consultants, representatives, parents, owners, brokers, affiliates, subsidiaries, board members and related entities and each of them of and from any and all claims, lawsuits, demands, debts, liabilities, remedies, damages, accounts, obligations, costs, expenses (including attorneys' fees), liens, indemnity, actions, and causes of action of every kind and nature, whether known or unknown, suspected or unsuspected, that they now own or hold or at any time heretofore has owned or held, based upon, related to or arising from any transaction, contract, tort, lien, liability, matter, cause, cause of action, fact, thing, conduct, act, or omission whatsoever, which the Parties may now have or may hereafter have arising out of or connected with the Dispute.

3. Waiver of Civil Code Section 1542

Contingent upon the full completion of the terms of this Agreement and the full crediting of the Settlement Amount, it is the intention of the Parties that the release entered into as part of this Agreement shall be effective as a bar to all actions, causes of action, obligations, costs, expenses, attorneys' fees, damages, losses, claims, liabilities and demands of any character, nature and kind, known or unknown, suspected or unsuspected related to the Dispute, to be so barred; in furtherance of which intention the Parties expressly waive any and all right and benefit conferred upon them by the provisions of Section 1542 of the California Civil Code, which reads as follows:

A general release does not extend to claims which the creditor does not know or suspect to exist in his or her favor at the time of executing the release, which if known by him or her must have materially affected his or her settlement with the debtor.

The Parties hereby acknowledge that the foregoing waiver of the provisions of Section 1542 of the California Civil Code was bargained for separately. The Parties hereto expressly agree that the release provisions herein contained shall be given full force and effect in accordance with each and all of their express terms and provisions, including but not limited to those terms and provisions relating to unknown or unsuspected claims, demands and causes of action hereinabove specified. The Parties specifically agree to assume the risk of the subsequent discovery or understanding of any matter, fact or law which if now known or understood would in any respect have affected this Agreement.

4. Representations and Warranty

Each Party represents and warrants that there has been no assignment or other transfer of any interest in any of the claims which are being released hereunder and that no person or entity other than the Parties hereto has or have any interest or claim against any of the other Parties regarding the Recitals above or as expressly reserved herein.

5. Compromise

This Agreement is the result of a compromise and shall never at any time or for any purpose be considered an admission of liability or responsibility on the part of any Party herein released, nor shall the payment or crediting of any sum of money in consideration for the execution of this Agreement constitute or be construed as an admission of any liability whatsoever, by any Party herein released, all of which continue to deny such liability and to disclaim such responsibility.

6. Consultation with Counsel

The Parties each represent and declare that they have carefully read this Agreement and know and understand its contents, and have had the advice of counsel regarding same (or ample opportunity to consult with counsel of their choosing), and that they sign the same freely and voluntary.

7. Neutral Interpretation

The language of this Agreement shall be construed as a whole according to its fair meaning and not strictly for or against any party.

8. Complete Agreement

This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement and understanding between the Parties concerning the subject matter hereof, and supersedes and replaces all prior negotiations and proposed agreements, written and/or oral. Each Party acknowledges to the other Party that no Party or agent or any attorney of any party has made any promise, representation or warranty whatsoever, express or implied, written or oral, not contained herein concerning the subject matter hereof to induce it to execute this agreement and each party acknowledges that it has not executed this Agreement in reliance upon any promise, representation or warranty not contained herein.

9. Applicable Law, Jurisdiction, and Venue

This Agreement shall, in all respects, be interpreted, enforced, and governed exclusively by and under the laws of the State of California.

10. Attorneys' Fees and Costs

Each Party will bear their own pre-Agreement attorneys' fees and costs.

11. Individuals Authorized

The Parties represent and warrant that the Party signatories to this Agreement have full authority to bind the Party each represents.

12. Signature in Counterpart

This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, any one of which shall be binding on any Party signing thereon. Photocopied copies, facsimile copies, electronic and scanned original documents shall be deemed originals and shall be valid, binding, and enforceable in accordance with their terms.

13. Severability

If any portion of this Agreement is declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, illegal, unconstitutional or unenforceable, such portion shall be deemed severed from this Agreement and the remaining parts shall remain in full force and effect as if no invalid or unenforceable provisions had been part of this Agreement.

EACH OF THE UNDERSIGNED HEREBY DECLARES THAT THE TERMS OF THIS AGREEMENT AND GENERAL RELEASE HAVE BEEN COMPLETELY READ AND ARE FULLY UNDERSTOOD, AND BY EXECUTION HEREOF VOLUNTARILY ACCEPTS THE TERMS WITH THE INTENT TO BE LEGALLY BOUND THEREBY.

AMENDMENT NO. 1 TO PURCHASE AND SALE AGREEMENT

This Amendment No. 1 to the Purchase and Sale Agreement dated May 31, 2023 (PSA) between DAVID and JULI BAUER, co-trustees of the D&J Bauer Family Trust 11- 18-04 ("Sellers") and BORREGO WATER DISTRICT ("District") amends the PSA as follows:

Paragraph I(A)(v) is added to the PSA as follows: "Notwithstanding the provisions

of Paragraph I(A)(ii),

above, and any other contrary provisions of the PSA, the Parties agree that the District's obligation to purchase 11% of the Buyer's BPA (200 acre feet) on or about October 1, 2024, shall be modified such that the District shall instead make two equal payments of \$180,978 to purchase such 200 acre feet of BPA. The first payment of \$180,978 shall be due on or about October 1, 2024. The second payment of \$180,978 shall be due on or about April 1, 2025. The two payments described in this subparagraph may be made outside of escrow. The Parties further agree that, in light of the two payment structure, Sellers shall transfer to Buyer 100 acre feet of BPA upon the making of each of the two payments. To accomplish this intent, Sellers agree to execute, at the time of receiving each of the two payments described above, a notarized Water Rights Grant Deed and any applicable Borrego Springs Watermaster forms necessary to accomplish these two transfers of 100 acre feet of BPA each."


